Centuries of history come to bear in Thunder Bay, the city by Lake Superior. Once a traditional meeting place for the Ojibwe, this city is part of Canada's long story, one that has experienced its share of kindness and pain, love and loss. Now it is time to come together to find a new path towards understanding so that all who call Thunder Bay home feel as though they belong.
